Note: Every child has a right to be immunised against these killer diseases.

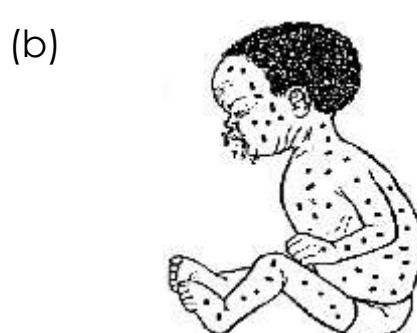
