#### **CHOOSING NEW LEADERS**

Pupils in Mpango Primary School hold elections every August to elect new prefects to lead pupils in the school. Mr. Munene, the P. 5 Science teacher, is in charge of organising elections for prefects in the school. The election process each year starts when Mr. Munene makes an announcement at parade, calling for interested pupils to pick forms from the staff room. The interested pupils fill the forms and give them to their class teachers. For any pupils to qualify to stand for a post of prefect, he/ she must be supported by at least five pupils from his / her class by signing on the forms.


The campaigns for those pupils who have met the requirements take two weeks. In those two weeks, candidates move from class to class during lunch period convincing pupils to vote for them on election day. Sometimes candidates bribe pupils with sweets, cakes or pencils to get their votes.

At the end of the campaign period, elections are held in the afternoon. The pupils choose their leaders by casting votes. The candidate who picks the highest number of votes for each post is declared the winner by the head teacher.


