## Item 1: Map Skills

For this item, use the East Africa 1: 50,000 (Uganda) map extract of **Masaka** Y732, Sheet 79/3 Edition 3-U.S. D, and the information in the text below to answer the tasks given:

(a) (i) Mr. Mbasani, is a lorry driver working for a coffee factory in Masaka at Kyanja (Grid reference 562628). When transporting coffee from the coffee plantation at Kingo, he parks the lorry and loads coffee at the motorable track that connects the plantation to Mabirizi and Mbarara main road at Grid reference 514627. He drives at a constant speed of 2 km/h.

Task: Determine the amount of time he needs to spend on one trip.

(ii) For a long time, communication between the people of Budda (Butenga sub county) and Ndegeya (Katwe sub county) in Masaka district has been restricted by the presence of Nabajuzi swamp. The engineering department of Masaka Local government plans to construct a bridge across the swamp to ease communication and promote trade between the two sub counties. The engineering team needs to understand the nature of the landscape to design a safe and efficient bridge. They are proposing the area between 550670 (Part of Budda) and 600670 (part of Ndegeya)

Task: Use a relevant illustration to help the engineering team understand the nature of the landscape of the proposed area.

(b) The establishment of a Sugarcane plantation and Sugar factory in the area of Bukoto, South West of Masaka has brought economic growth in the area. There is evidence of development of roads like Kinoni – Kiziba road, a Post Office and a Sub County Headquarter. They have attracted settlements in the area. However, a group of residents have raised environmental issues about this development.

Task: What kind of advice do you give to the management of the Sugarcane plantation and Sugar factory

Other technological innovations like hydroponic farming are being used. These ensures a steady supply of food. Many communities in Uganda and other parts of Africa living along river courses, however, continue to suffer from food insecurity, malnutrition and famine. The Ministry of agriculture is organizing a sensitization workshop to transform the livelihood of these communities.



The agro-industrialization programme annual performance report for the 2022/2023 financial year by the Ministry of Agriculture, Animal Industry and Fisheries (MAIIF) indicate that "The share of agricultural exports to the total exports increased from 33% in the 2021/2022 financial year to 41.8% in the 2022/2023 financial year". This is however still below the target set in the National Development Plan to increase the export value of priority commodities from \$0.935 billion (Shs 3.6 trillion) in 2017 to \$2.7 billion (Shs 10.4 trillion) by 2025.


Item 6: Study the text and support material (table 1) provided to answer the task.
