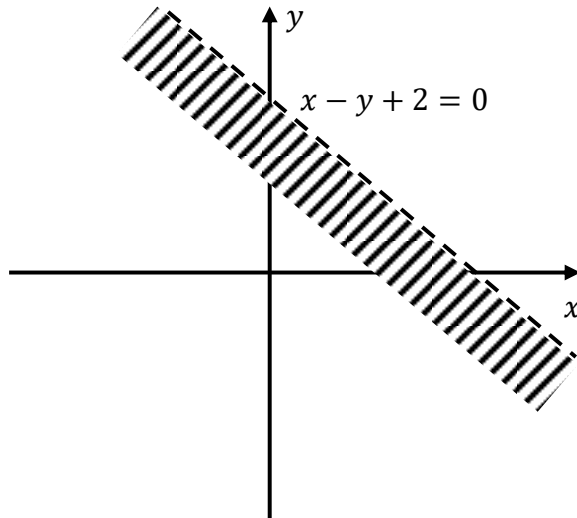
$$\sqrt{(x+1)^2 + (y-4)^2} > \sqrt{(x-2)^2 + (y-1)^2}$$
